

When Lt. Henry Timberlake visited the area in 1762, most of the towns still had Muskogean names, i.e., Tallassee, Chilhowie, Settiquo, Tanasi, Toquo, Tommotley and Tuskeegee, even though they were occupied by Cherokee. Only Chota founded in 1735 and Mialaquo founded about 1755 bore Cherokee names.

Although there had been a number of visitors to Cherokee Territory in the 1700's, documentation of Cherokee customs, traditions and lifestyle was sparse. That changed with Henry Timberlake's "*Map and Memoirs*", (the most complete account of 18th Century Cherokee life).
