

A French Agent and his guide wait for the dark of the moon to meet with other woodland Indians and to carry out raids into the English settlements during the *French and Indian War*, 1754 — 1763.

The conflict is known by several names. In <u>British America</u>, wars were often named after the sitting British monarch, such as <u>King William's War</u> or <u>Queen Anne's War</u>. Because there had already been a <u>King George's War</u> in the 1740s, British colonists named the second war in <u>King George's</u> reign after their opponents, and thus it became known as the *French and Indian War*. This traditional name remains standard in the United States, although it obscures the fact that <u>American Indians</u> fought on both sides of the conflict.
